Enhancing Human-Centered Recovery

ReEmployAbility connects injured workers to a greater sense of purpose throughout their recovery. Transition2Work supports a holistic healing experience by offering meaningful light-duty assignments that promote emotional, social, and overall well-being. This human-centered experience is further enhanced through innovative tools that give injured workers the clarity and support they need throughout their Transition2Work assignments.

New in 2025, the Injured Worker Portal, powered by Crosstie, enhances the injured worker's experience by giving employees clear, on-demand access to their assignment details and expectations. Many injured workers are actively using this self-service resource, demonstrating strong adoption of the digital platform. Across recent Transition2Work assignments, employees who activate the portal before their start date consistently show higher levels of participation, highlighting a direct connection between digital engagement and improved involvement throughout the recovery process.
